We need your help!

The task of building our Family of Parishes is immense. To get six wonderful, vibrant Parishes to work together as one Family for the renewal of the Church in our part of Erie County is a complex undertaking. Some of the first steps were rather obvious. Having to deal with the reality that there would be three active priests, along with one technically retired priest who is just as active as he ever was, where previously there had been 6, forced us to make some painful, but necessary decisions on Mass schedules and other liturgical timetables.

Forming a Family Council representing all six communities using the framework given us by the Diocese was another apparent beginning action to take. There is much work to be done and after the evident initial projects, the work is becoming more complex. One of my favorite parts of building our Family has been getting to know the wonderful people who make up the backbone of each Parish. So many of these parochial leaders have stepped forward right from the start of the Road to Renewal in 2021. The task is so massive, however, that very quickly the original volunteers were overwhelmed with the volume of meetings and commitments that were necessary. Learning from that questionable beginning, we scaled back expectations and lengthened the timetable for the Family transition. Now we are taking up a new phase of building our Family. We need additional volunteers to staff the "Pillar Groups" that have already begun to operate.

A pillar is defined as a supporting column that helps a structure to hold together. The Diocese has proposed that there are 6 Pillar areas that demonstrate the vitality of a Family and the Parishes that make up that Family. A chart of those Pillars and the area of Parish life that each is concerned with is printed to the right. We need "fresh blood" to step forward and offer their time and expertise in these Pillar Group Committees to ensure that our Family can continue to grow.

We are especially in need of anyone with experience in Strategic Planning and Organizational Structure.

A report was made to remind the members that all of our Parishes are in good financial standing, without debts. This assists in solidifying the futures of each Parish for the foreseeable future. There was also a reminder that with more Families beginning their formation process, there may be further movement of clergy around the Diocese. As of right now, there will be no changes to our Family.

At their February meeting, two Family Council members were assigned to each of the six Pillar groups. These Pillars are what were used in the forming of our Family. The co-chairs from the Council will now work with the original and new Pillar members to continue to work on the goals that were originally outlined in the Renewal process and to work on new goals for our future. To learn more about the Pillar groups, see Fr. Rich's letter on the first page.

Parish Finance Managers have been meeting frequently to discuss how to best handle finances of each Parish and any bills for our Family of Parishes. This meeting is led by Fr. Bart, who reports their findings back to the Family Council. They will meet again in March.

The Secretaries of each Parish are also meeting once a quarter now to ensure that there is information sharing across all Parishes.

A Family Worship Committee is starting to meet which includes the music ministers and other important liturgy planning members from each Parish. This is to assist in sharing ideas and ensuring all our Parishes have the best liturgical experiences we can offer.

My goal as a member of the Council is to help guide us through the difficulties that we face in the near term. Long term, I hope to help us rebuild our Faith community and become an even stronger entity as one Family.



God loves us – all of us and He wants us to recognize that

His mercy is greater than our sins and this feast celebrates the mercy God grants us through Jesus. The best way to remember the Divine Mercy message is through using ABC:

Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

1. Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy.


We celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus alone as a symbol of "God's boundless and passionate love for mankind." This feast always falls on the third Friday after Pentecost (June 7th this year). This is also where our Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish takes its name from and celebrates its Parish Feast Day on this special day, but both days are extremely special to this Parish in particular.

An indulgence is granted to the faithful who, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, recite the Our Father and the Creed,

adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"). Those who attend the special Divine Mercy events and wish to be granted an indulgence must attend confession, receive the Eucharist, and pray for the intentions of the Pope.

Even though confessed and forgiven sins will not send a person to hell, consequences remain to be paid on earth or in purgatory. An indulgence frees the recipient from those consequences. Reception of an indulgence always springs from sincere repentance and the desire to live a holy life. An indulgence cannot be bought, nor can one be obtained by going through the motions without sincerity.

In our Family of Parishes, we will be hosting a special Divine Mercy afternoon, including Adoration, Confessions, the Chaplet and Mass at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish to assist you in achieving your indulgence. All are invited to join us in this special celebration!



I am Seamus McCarthy, 21, of Our Lady of Pompeii Parish. I attended Our Lady of Pompeii school until it closed in 2014. After the closure, I was home schooled for the duration of middle school and for high school. Currently, I am attending Erie Community part-time.

My mother's side of the family has belonged to this Parish since it opened

in 1909, so when our family moved to Lancaster in the mid-2000s, it was only natural for us to join Pompeii. The thing I most enjoy about Our Lady of Pompeii is the people. From the generous, faithful Parishioners to the dedicated, caring staff... it is a joy to be on campus.

Through my teen years, I slowly drifted away from the Church. I was disenchanted with the institutional Church and certainly our Diocese surrounding the closure of Pompeii's school in 2014. The death of my grandmother in 2015 only accelerated things. Our family often went to Mass with my grandmother, and not having her to go with us made it easy to not take Faith as seriously and not go to Mass as a family. Especially after she passed, my Faith was lukewarm, and I didn't really care about it. I stopped going to Mass right after Easter of 2016 and returned right before Easter of 2022.

After six years away from the Faith, I was lost. My life was filled with unhappiness, anxiety, and despair, and I had no idea where to turn. I often pondered the meaning of life and whether there was a point to it all. Not knowing where to turn or what else to do, I decided to return to Church and to Pompeii.

To renew my Faith, I started by returning to Mass. I went

to Mass for a couple weeks and knowing that I needed to go to Confession to receive Communion, I went to Confession before a daily Mass at Our Lady of Pompeii. It was the first




time I had gone to Confession in eight years, and it felt like a weight of infinite magnitude had been lifted off my shoulders. Receiving Jesus for the first time in years that day, all felt right in the world. After this, I decided to continue attending daily Mass.

From there, many devotions began. I started regularly praying the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. My favorite scripture verse is the Bread of Life discourse in John, Chapter 6. It helps me to reflect on the reality of the Real Presence, it reminds and encourages me to receive Jesus as often as possible, and in a state of grace.

Since returning to church, I have become involved in various ministries throughout the Parish. I am a Sacristan, and I serve at Masses. I run the Altar Server program and the Live Stream Ministry. I am also an EDGE Core Team Member and assist with a sandwich ministry run out of the Parish. I also work for our Parish, assisting wherever needed.

As I continued to attend Mass daily, I began to be overwhelmed by a sense of peace and happiness.

I would sit there during Mass and wonder if this was something I could do. These feelings, along with memories of the joyful, reverent



My Faith keeps me grounded and focused on the things that matter. It helps me to place less importance on the many things of this world that are less important. I was blessed to be put in a position where I could build/rebuild my life, and honestly my day, around prayer. Having this foundation has been of special importance to me, especially when life gets difficult and/or chaotic.

As I continue my journey, please know of my prayers for you, along with our Priests and Parishes, during these changing times. Always trust in God's plan. Blessed Virgin Mary, pray for us!






A wonderful way to not only connect personally, but collectively with the Eucharist and Christ, this mission brought approximately 300 of our Parishioners together for two nights during Lent.







Don't you find yourself singing along in your head as you read the lyrics? I know that I do. What a beautiful reverent hymn this is. We often sing this during a guided Holy Hour or at weekend Masses in praise and adoration of our God!

This hymn was first published in 1774 by Ignaz Franz, a German Catholic priest. It is based on the 4th century Latin hymn "Te Deum" ('Thee, God, we praise'). As a result of German immigration in the 19th century, this hymn became popular and was translated into English by an American Catholic priest, Clarence Walworth.

I love lyrics that can be prayed with or without the music. That might sound strange to some people but consider this. If you're sitting at Eucharistic Adoration or perhaps waiting for Mass to begin, pick up a hymnal and read the words as a prayer. They can really bring your mind to focus.

"Holy Father, Holy Son,

Holy Spirit, Three we name thee; While in essence only one, Undivided God we claim thee:

And adoring, bend the knee, While we own the mystery. And adoring, bend the knee, While we own the mystery."

Just praying the words helps you to come closer to God. And singing the words? St. Augustine said that singing was praying twice. And if you're worried about the quality of your voice? Just remember that this is between you and God and he wants you to make a joyful noise. (Psalm 98:4)
